Application Procedure	Upon nomination or acceptance to participating in and OSUN exchange to AUBG,
	students should fill in and submit the application form. Applications deadlines are
	October 30 th for the spring term and May 30 th for the fall term.
Institution Application	You will need to attach a transcript of records and a copy of your international
Requirements	passport.
Acceptance to AUBG	You'll receive an official acceptance letter confirming your exchange at AUBG, usually
	one week after the application is submitted.
Orientation Meeting	Accepted students committed to attending AUBG must participate in an OSUN Zoom
	meeting and zoom pre-departure orientation. For information about campus life at

Course Enrollment	Students should complete the OSUN Student Mobility Learning Agreement and have
	approval from their home institution for their planned courses.
Course Registration	Students Register their courses online
Registration Dates	Registration is over one week each semester; notification will be provided ahead of
	time via email.
Course Eligibility	Students can choose from all of the courses offered as long as prerequisites are
	fulfilled where applicable.
Semester Dates	Fall Semester: September – December
	Spring Semester: January – May
Undergraduate Course Load	Students should follow the minimum requirement for full-time status according to
	their home university and should not exceed 17 credits per semester.

Registration Instructions	You will be sent info about registration; however, course registration is coordinated
	through the Study Abroad Manager.
Method of Instruction	The class format is based on lectures, readings, class participation and self-study.
	Students are expected to attend all lectures, to complete all course-related
	assignments and readings, and to sit exams and/or submit a final paper in order to
	receive a course grade.
Credits	1 AUBG credit is equal to 2 ECTS credits.

Accommodations

Housing	OSUN Exchange students will be accommodated in AUBG Residence Halls https://www.aubg.edu/students-residential-life
Student Orientation	Students should arrive on campus for the orientation week one week before courses begin.
Airport Transport	AUBG will arrange pick up to and from the airport in Sofia.
Cost of Meals	You will have a meal card loaded with \$100 that you will be able to add to. The estimated monthly cost of food is around \$400 per month depending upon the person.
Cost of Books	Students can expect to pay around \$200 / semester for textbooks.
Health Insurance	Students will have health insurance through AUBG for the semester.
Disability Accommodation	The University will make every effort to be accommodating to students that have notified Pavlina Pavlova at pavlinap@aubg.edu from International Student Services of their disability needs.

VISA Information	
	As an exchange international student accepted for study at the American University
VISA	in Bulgaria, you must have a long-term student visa, type D. To get this visa, you need
	to apply at the Bulgarian embassy in the country of your permanent residence not
	earlier than three months before the traveling date and not later than one month
	before that date. Because the visa process is slow and time-consuming, you must
	allow time for it. Our experience shows that you should allow at least 30 working
	days for the Bulgarian Embassy to issue the visa.
	Please keep in mind that you should apply for a visa no later than June 15 if you have
	been accepted for the fall semester and no later than November 1 if you have been
	accepted for the spring semester.
Visa Application Process for EU and	As an exchange student with non-US or non-EU citizenship, accepted for study at the
Non-US Citizens	American University in Bulgaria, you must have a long-term student visa, type D.
	To get this visa, you need to apply IN PERSON at the Bulgarian embassy or the
	nearest Consulate not earlier than 3 months before the traveling date and not later
	than one month before that date. Because the visa process is slow and time-
	consuming, you must allow time for it. Our experience shows that you should allow
	at least 30 working days for the Bulgarian Embassy to issue the visa.
	Please keep in mind that you should apply for a visa not later than June 15 if you
	have been accepted for the fall semester and not later than November 1 if you have
	been accepted for the spring semester.
	Here's an outline of the process:
	Step one
	Please contact International Student Office at iso@aubg.edu and request your visa
	certificate.
	Step two
	After that AUBG will issue a Certificate, stating that you are accepted at AUBG, you
	will live on campus, and you will have insurance upon arrival.
	Step three The AUBG certificate will be express mailed to you. Please give an exact mailing
	address. This should be a street address, not a post office box. Note that mailing
	expenses will be charged to your student bill.
	Step four
	Finally, you must submit the following documents required for a long-term visa to
	the Bulgarian embassy in your country:
	One completed visa <u>application form</u>
	AUBG certificate – provided by AUBG
	 Document proving that you will be able to cover your living expenses – valid bank account with 4,000 BGN or the equivalent in USD
	Valid passport
	Two copies of the information pages of your passport;
	 One current passport photo (European sized – 3.5×4.5cm)
	Document about paid visa fee (200 EUR)

Double-check with the Bulgarian embassy where you will apply if these are all the required documents as visa procedures are subject to change.

Make sure that you submit original documents and two copies to the Bulgarian Embassy.

Step five

When the visa is ready, go to the Bulgarian embassy to pick it up. Make sure you carry your passport with you. Please notify the International Student Services Office that you have received your visa.

Step six

You may travel to Bulgaria **after** the visa is entered in your passport. Please **do not** buy a non-refundable ticket until you receive your visa.

Visa Process for US Citizens

As an **U.S.** exchange or visiting international student accepted for study at the American University in Bulgaria, you must have a long-term student visa, type D. To get this visa, you need to apply at the Bulgarian embassy in the country of your permanent residence not earlier than three months before the traveling date and not later than one month before that date. Because the visa process is slow and time-consuming, you must allow time for it. Our experience shows that you should allow at least **30** working days for the Bulgarian Embassy to issue the visa.

Please keep in mind that you should apply for a visa **not later than June 15** if you have been accepted for the **fall semester** and not later than **November 1** if you have been accepted for the **spring semester**.

Here's an outline of the process:

Step one

Please contact International Student Office at iso@aubg.edu and request your visa certificate.

Step two

After that AUBG will issue a Certificate, stating that you are accepted at AUBG, you will live on campus, and you will have insurance upon arrival.

Step three

The AUBG certificate will be express mailed to you. **Please give an exact mailing address.** This should be a street address, not a post office box. <u>Note that mailing expenses</u> will be charged to your student bill.

Step four

Finally, you must submit the following documents required for a long-term visa to the Bulgarian embassy in your country:

- One completed visa application form;
- AUBG certificate provided by AUBG;
- Document proving that you will be able to cover your living expenses valid bank account with 4,000 BGN or the equivalent in USD;
- Valid passport;
- Two copies of the information pages of your passport;
- One current passport photo (European sized 3.5×4.5cm).

You are exempt from visa fees according to an agreement signed between the Government of the Republic of Bulgaria and the U.S. Government.

Please double-check with the Bulgarian embassy where you will apply if these are all the required documents as visa procedures are subject to change.
